Основна мета – допомогти вчителю у доборі усних та письмових вправ, лексичних одиниць для перевірки знань учнів.

Збірка призначена для учнів та вчителів. Її можна ефективно використовувати під час фронтального опитування, для повторення вивченого матеріалу, а також для індивідуальної роботи з учнями.

Передмова

Збірка призначена для перевірки знань учнів з предмета «Англійська мова».

Складається з шести частин: I частина - «VOCABULARY TEST», II частина - «GRAMMAR TEST», III частина – «TRANSLATE THE SENTENCES INTO ENGLISH», IV частина - «MOST USED PHRASES», V частина – «400 POPULAR ENGLISH WORDS» VI частина - «READING WITH PLEASURE».

Перша частина містить лексичний тест довжиною шістдесят одиниць, який передбачає перевірку засвоєної лексики. До кожної одиниці тесту подано три або чотири варіанти відповідей, в яких лише один варіант є правильним. До деяких одиниць потрібно самостійно підібрати правильне слово по контексту.

Друга частина містить граматичний тест довжиною в 130 одиниць. Тест передбачає перевірку засвоєних граматичних правил, конструкцій (часові форми дієслова, узгодження та вживання часових форм, модальні дієслова, прийменник, прикметник, вживання артиклів, числівник).

Третя частина містить сорок одиниць речень для перекладу, які охоплюють вивчений лексико-граматичний матеріал згідно з робочим навчальним планом.

Четверта і п'ята частини містять короткий перелік найбільш вживаних слів, фраз, виразів, засвоєння яких збагатить словниковий запас учнів та полегшить спілкування іноземною мовою.

Шоста частина містить короткі, цікаві, гумористичні, повчальні історії, опрацювання яких сприяє вдосконаленню мовленнєвих та комунікативних компетентностей.

У процесі виконання учні можуть використовувати підручники з англійської мови і словники.


Основна мета – допомогти вчителю у доборі усних та письмових вправ, лексичних одиниць для перевірки знань учнів.

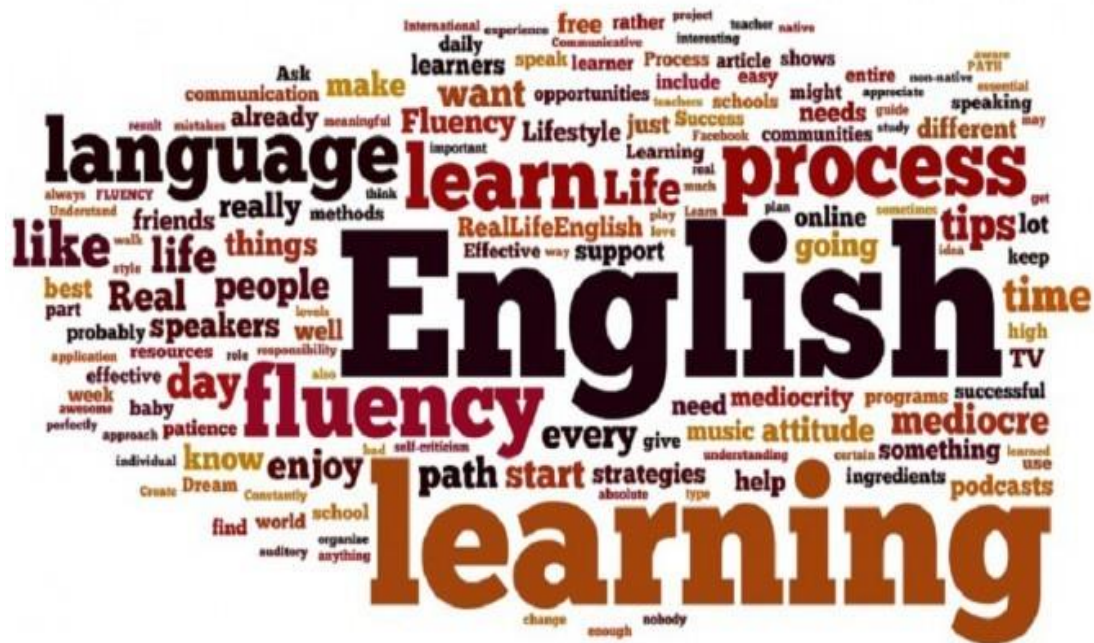
